Twentieth Anniversary of C.M.B.A. in Calgary

Calgary branch No. 126 of the Catholic Mutual Benefit Association, or the C. M. B. A., as it is more generally known, will today celebrate the twentieth anniversary of its organization. The history of the C. M. B. A. dates back to Dec. 1, 1878, when the first association was instituted in the village of Niagara Falls, with fifty-seven charter members.

Two years later the membership had sufficiently increased in Ontario, to warrant the formation of a grand council which was incorporated in January, 1880, and on Dec. 27, 1894, it received a charter from the Dominion government, authorizing it to do business in any part of Canada.

In 1895, the grand council of the C. M. B. A. of Canada formed itself into a separate body, thus severing itself from the C. M. B. A. of the United States. Since that date the Association has made wonderful progress and has extended its operations to every province of the Dominion, its membership being now about 30,000.

Such in brief is the history of the general progress of the association; its objects, aims and work will be dealt with in detail further on.

Calgary branch No. 126, was organized on April 9, 1890, at a meeting held in the law office of Loughheed, McCarthy & Beck at which Mr. Beck, now Mr. Justice Beck of the supreme court of Alberta, who was then acting secretary for Dr. J. K. Barrett, Inspector of inland revenue, then district grand deputy for Manitoba and the North West Territories, initiated the following gentlemen and constituted Calgary branch No. 126.

The charter members, some of whom established now stands, and which had previously been purchased by the separate school board for a school, in which place the association met for a number of years, fortnightly, commencing on April 22, 1890. The meeting place for the association was fixed for the old Methodist church, where Shavers' undertaking from which, within sixty days after the receipt at the office of the secretary of the association of satisfactory evidence of the death of a member, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars, shall be paid to dependents or other beneficiary, whom the deceased member has designated by the association to the widow, orphan or to the legal representatives of such deceased member.

Since the formation of the grand council about \$5,000,000 have been paid to the heirs of deceased brothers and it can easily be understood what a vast amount of good has been effected by the means among the Catholics of Canada.

A reserve fund, a measure towards the perpetuation of the association was established in 1887, which now amounts to over \$300,000.

The restrictions as to membership in the association are that applicants for membership must be practical

Since its organization Calgary branch No. 126, has paid out about \$20,000 to beneficiaries to the widow and orphan or other relatives of deceased members.

The objects of the C. M. B. A. as stated in its constitution are: "To improve the social, intellectual and moral condition of the members and to elevate them in integrity, sobriety and frugality."
"To establish, manage and disburse a mutual benefit and reserve fund

in which members receive treatment and care at one half of the regular rate.

The members of the Calgary branch are very earnest in looking out for cases of distress among the members and many instances of charity and assistance are given, which are not recorded on the books of the association.

disbursed members who have suffered from illness or accident.

Disfranchisement and clerical have been found to be numbered among its members and have watched over its proceedings and valued it as a great auxiliary.

MR. O'CONNOR, one of the officials of the C. M. B. A., Catholics, minus not under eighteen years of age, nor over fifty years at date of initiation; must pass a medical examination, be approved by the supervising medical examiner, the branch board of trustees, and elected by ballot of the branch to which application is made.

The reasons on which the C. M. B. ITINERARY OF PRINCE'S TOUR
Departure from England Will Be About End of August
London, April 7.—The Prince of Wales has received a draft informal program from South Africa regarding the forthcoming royal visit, and in due course the main features will receive his royal highness' attention.

The prince and princess will go to South Africa by the West Coast route in a chartered liner, either in the new Union Castle mail boat Balmorac Castle, or, not improbably, in a smaller vessel, like the Kilmarna Castle. The vessel selected will be accompanied by an escort of warships.

The departure from England will be towards the end of August and the port of embarkation will be Durban. The capitals of the four provinces and the capital of Rhodesia will be visited and probably there will be a visit to the Victoria Falls. The first Union parliament will be opened at the end of the tour, immediately before the departure of the prince and princess for England.
