It was car-ried as the result of one of the most violent attacks on a fortified position that has occurred in the European war. It should be remembered that Austria had given particular attention to the fortifications of Gorizia, which, owing to the difficult nature of the ground and the manner in which the neights had been fortified, were regarded as impregnable."
