This is the first of a series of Friday evening meetings, and at a subsequent meeting before Sept. 3 the mayor and aldermen, together with the London Chamber of Commerce will be invited to attend to get in touch with the actual needs of the situation.

Officials of the Labor party estimate that about two thousand men in the city are now unemployed.
