NIAGARA SUICIDES

Great River Gives Up Fourth Body Within Week—Ghastly Record Broken

Niagara Falls, N. Y., July 3.—The river this afternoon gave up its fifth body within a month and the fourth within a week. Never before in the history of the river have so many bodies jeen found floating in the lower Niagara in a week, and the record of 1908, when 13 suicides occurred at or near the cataract, bids fair to be broken.

The body recovered today was floating near-the Maid of the Mist landing. It is that of a man about 40 years old 5 feet 9 inches in height, weight 140 pounds, nude except for a pair of black socks and one black shoe. It had not been in the water long. Identification may be established by the teeth, which contain considerable gold.
