**ALL PEACEFUL.**  
There is no trouble in the camp, as  
the Tribune stated, if any errors  
appear in the town report the printer  
is not responsible, as the Town Clerk  
has assumed the responsibility of se-  
ing that all corrections are made and  
he reads the proofs.

**LUMBER FIRM ASSIGNS.**  
The assignment of Messrs. Andre  
Cushing & Sons, lumber manufactur-  
ers, was heard with surprise and re-  
gret on Tuesday. The Eastern Trust  
Co. are the assigners, and the liabil-  
ities are estimated at half a million  
dollars, the largest share to the  
Union Bank of Halifax. Mr. George  
S. Cushing is the sole owner of the  
property. There is a holding com-  
pany, Cushings, Ltd. incorporated in  
1908, with a capital of \$350,000. The  
bank, it is understood, has security on  
the valuable property of the firm and  
will carry on the work in the mills for  
the present at least. There are three  
mills—the splendidly equipped mill at  
Union Point, built in 1896 when the  
old mill was destroyed by fire; the  
box mill at Millford, which is also well  
equipped, and a shingle mill at the  
same place. The big mill saws prin-  
cipally for the American markets, but  
Messrs. Cushing have also done a  
large business with the Canadian Is-  
lands, Madeira and South America.  
It was in 1851 that Theophilus and  
Andre Cushing of Frankfort, Maine,  
bought mills at Union Point which  
has been built and conducted by Bos-  
ton capitalists. In time Mr. G. Byron  
son of Theophilus, succeeded his fa-  
ther in the business. Mrs. Marion  
Andre and G. Byron died years ago,  
and Mr. Geo. S. Cushing, son of the  
latter, has been conducting the busi-  
ness with enterprise and vigor for a  
long time. As 400 persons are em-  
ployed in the industries it is impor-  
tant that the mills should be kept  
going.—Globe.

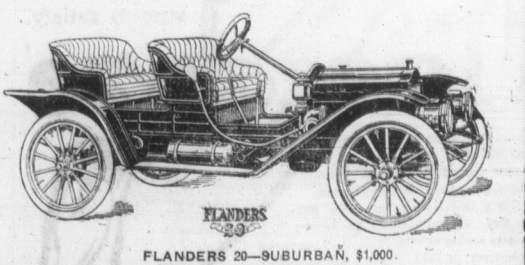
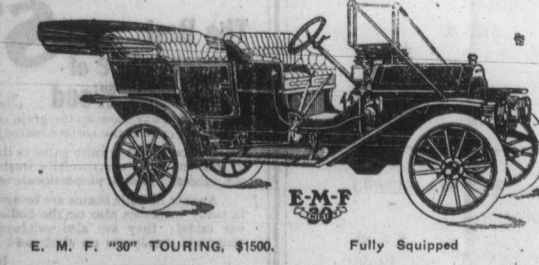
