EVIDENCE IN THE MIDDLE-ROAD TRAGEDY COMPLETE.

ositive Proof That Mac Wherrell Was in Possession of Williams' Horse Within a Few Hours of the Time the Old Couple Were Last Seen Alive-Sold the

Murdered Man's Pocketbook, When the trial of Walter MacWherrall and John Walker, charged with the murder of James Williams and his wife on the Middle-road, Toronto Township, on Dec. 14 iast, opens at Brampton, before Mr. Justice Ferguson, on March 12, one of the strongest ases known in criminal annals will be pre-

sented to the jury.

At the preliminary examination evidence was presented showing that MacWherrell had possession at noon of the following day of the horse and rig stolen from the farm at the time of the murder. Where it was between the time the murder is believed to have been committed, 6 o'clock Thursday night, and noon the next day is what Detective Greer has been endeavoring to ascertain. This he has at length accomplished. A witness has been found who saw MacWherrell and Walker driving the stolen horse and rig in this city between 8 and 9 o'clock on Thursday night. The witness has since inspected both horse and rig, and is positive in his identification. This fact settles beyond dispute that the murder was committed on Thursday night and within an hour or two after MacWherrell called at the house of Mrs. McKay, a few rods from the scene of the murder, and inquired the way to the Williams residence. The theory that the murder was committed on Friday, based on the fact that a telephone wire which had presumably been blown down on the gateway during the terrific gale of Friday showed unmistakable signs that the runners of a sleigh had passed over it, will be exploded by the evidence of the lineman, who will swear that the wire was down at least two days previous to the Friday storm.
