#### The Late Mr. David Higgins.

David Higgins, for many years an old and respected resident of the township of Warwick, died at the residence of his son, Robert A. Higgins, sixth line, on son, Robert A. O.L. 1029 and through faithful attendance in later years, was made an honorary member. Nine children, sevent daughters and two sons, are left to mourn the loss. The tuneral was largely attended, service being ably conducted at Bethesda church by Rev. R. C. Burton, under the auspices of L. O. L. 1029. The text was II. Timothy, 4 chapter, 6, 7 and 8 verses; Scripture lesson, Revelations, 21st chapter. Interment at St. James cemetery, Brooke. The floral offerings were many and beautiful. The pall bearers were Albert Higgins, George Higgins, Richard Higgins, Adam Higgins, Thomas-Higgins and R. J. Lucas.
