The spruce lumber market sliows no migns of recovery. Sume of the manufacturery are considering the advisubility of ntoring their loges until the price improves, as the present selling figures will not cover the cost of production. Spruce, claptoards bive held up remarknbly well: $f$-foot buardy are bringing $\$ 42$ to $\$+3$ for Bovton delivery, while the o-fuot boards are quoted at $\$ 56$, the latter being a decline of about $S_{+}$as compared with the closing figures of latst season. Shirgle pricer are a trifle easier, Exiras for Bonton delivery seithg at $\$ 3.30$ tu $\$ 3.35$; Cliears, $\$ 2.80$ to $\$ 2 . \mathrm{H}_{5}$, rind Second Clears, 2.25 10 $\$ 2.35$. Slocks at the mills, howeser, are light, and it will only require a moderate increase in demand tu get back to the $\$ 3.50$ basis for extras.
manitura and british coll mbia.
Lumber manutacturers have no complaint to make in respect to the volume of consumption througbout the NorttWest. Building operutions are absorbing a very Jarge quantity of tumber. The permits issued this year in the city of $W$ innipeg represent a valuation of nearly $\boldsymbol{\$}_{4}$,$\infty 00,000$, and in liancouver there have been over 450 houses erected since the first of the year. So much American lumber is being dumped on the Canadian market, however, that the benefit of this activity is loat to the Canadian manufacturer. The outlook in British Columbia is quite gloomy, the prenident of the British Columhia Loggers Aspociation having announced that all logging camps in the province would soon be shut down indefinitely, which means that several thorsand men will be thrown out of employment.

## UNITED STATES.

The Jumber market of the United States is about stationary and seems, in a measure, to be waiting on the oulcome of the crops, which at the present tinue kive promise of an atundant jield. All box grades of pint are in good demand and dry stocks are running low. Some of the eastern markets report an increased demand, while from other district: a talling of in sales is announced. The lower grades are showing more strergth and activity than the higher gracies. The action of the price list commitiec of the Mississippi Valley l.umbermen's . 1 sociation has created a atronger
feeling of confidence in the situe tiun. Aher thorowghly conoldering condlcions, it wan conadered unwise to mate matorial changes in the price list, but several advances ware decided upon, including the following: 12 -inch No. 1 boards and products, is in. and wider, S2: 12 -inch No. 1 boardy, 10, 14 and 16 foel, 50 cents: a ifeet, $81.50 ; 18$ and 20 reet, 81; 10 -inch No. 1 boards, 10 feet, 30 cents; 181030 feet, $\$ 1.50$; 8inch No. 1 boards, 12 and 14 feet, 50 cents: 6 -trich No. 1 facing, 6 feet, $\$ 1$; 12 to 20 teet, 50 cents. Norway siding and Alooring were reduced by Irom 50 centin lu 32, and 8, 10 and 12 inch D seleci, $\$ 2$.
There is nut a heavy movement of hard woody, and the demand is largely for firsts and recnuds and culis, leaviog common womewhat neglected. Plain wawed oak is firm and io kood demand. Dry birch stocks are about clearnd ont. giving a firmness to that lumber.

The imports of suwn lumber into the United Kiagdow during the firnt fire months of thi, year were $1,031,137$ loads, is against $1,177,266$ loads for the corresponding perind of 1903. As the stocky held at the leading porty are lighter than at the close of last year, it would seem that the consumption has been greater than the import. This is not likely to conitnue tbroughout the manmer monilhs, as roceipta will be more liberal. There has been little change for the better in the lumber aituation. Many buyers would like to contract for their supplies, but they lear that after they have placed their orders shippers might make a further cut in prices in order to precipiate seles. This is hardly expected, but there is suffi cient doubt refarding the matter to indure continuance of the non-committal policy. The price of white pine deals is still so bigh as to restrict the consumption, while apruce doals have so many competitora that the buyer ran ulwaye oblain his roquirements from one source if not from another. The demand for square pine is Now, white waney is a little more active.

K., a sharp recovery will unte place.
