at last made a beginning in Foreign Mission Work, having remitted a substantial contribution to the great missionary societies in England. The results of our Parochial Mission Work were severely criticised by Canon Dumoulin, who could only find us credited in the Synod reports for 1881-82, with a sum of \$290, and assumed that that was our total contribution. amount, however, raised in our Parish during the year ending Easter, 1882, for missions and charities was \$1,473, of which \$680 went to the Diocesan and Home Mission Funds in various

The Bishop announced that since last Easter he had received from our Parochial and Missionary Society "in solid cash" \$853.
