

AGASSIZ, B.C.—Tenders have been called for building new Presbyterian church.

SYDNEY MINES, N.S.—The School Board have secured a site for the new Academy building.

ST. BONIFACE, MAN.—The Council have decided to call for tenders for construction of sewers.

COATICOOK, QUE.—Tenders are invited by O. Shurtleff up to August 3rd for repairing school house.

BOWMANVILLE, ONT.—The Rehder Plating & Mfg. Co., of Thorold, Ont., will erect a factory in this town.

FERGUS, ONT.—Dr. Groves is understood to be getting new plans prepared for the private hospital to be built here.

BERLIN, ONT.—Arrangements are under way for the rebuilding of the Baxter-Galloway grist mill, destroyed by fire last spring.

WATERFORD, ONT.—The tenders for town hall were found to be too high, and the plans will be modified and new tenders invited.

WOODVILLE, ONT.—The congregation of the Presbyterian church are considering the putting in of new furnaces and new pipe organ.

CHARLOTTETOWN, P. E. I.—The time for receiving tenders for new Presbyterian church on St. Peters Road has been extended to August 1st.

NORTH SYDNEY, N.S.—It is stated that a Boston syndicate will at once commence the construction of an electric railway between Sydney and Glace Bay, at a cost of \$750,000.—The Dominion Government is being urged to erect a round-house and terminal facilities at this place.

GLACE BAY, N.S.—The town has invited tenders for installation of electric light plant and is considering the advisability of constructing a waterworks system.—Tenders close August 5th for purchase of \$30,000 corporation debentures. Particulars from M. McIntosh, town clerk.

ST. JOHN, N.B.—The City Council is considering the question of erecting a new city hall.

LITTLE CURRENT, ONT.—A by-law to raise \$1,500 for sidewalks and drainage was submitted to the voters on Monday last. Result not learned.

GUELPH, ONT.—The Guelph Provision Co. has been incorporated, with capital of \$25,000, and will build a pork packing factory on the outskirts of the city.

BROCKVILLE, ONT.—The city engineer has been instructed to visit a number of cities and report on the feasibility of constructing granolithic walks on a cheaper specification.

SYDNEY, N.S.—At the annual meeting of the Cape Breton Railway Extension Co., held in Montreal last week, it was decided to build branch lines to important coal and iron districts.

HALIFAX, N.S.—Officials of the Intercolonial Railway visited Halifax last week and decided upon improvements at Richmond and the deep water terminus. The improvements will represent an expenditure of \$200,000. A new round house will be erected opposite Mulgrave Park.

TORONTO, ONT.—Ald. Frame has given notice in council of a motion that a by-law be submitted to the ratepayers in January next to raise \$20,000 for a municipal asphalt plant.—S. H. Davis, architect, wants tenders from all trades for erection of store and house, 1294 Queen street west.—Mr. Frank Azaoli, K.C., who has recently let contracts for a number of houses on Strickland Place, is considering the advisability of filling up the remainder of the street with new dwellings. 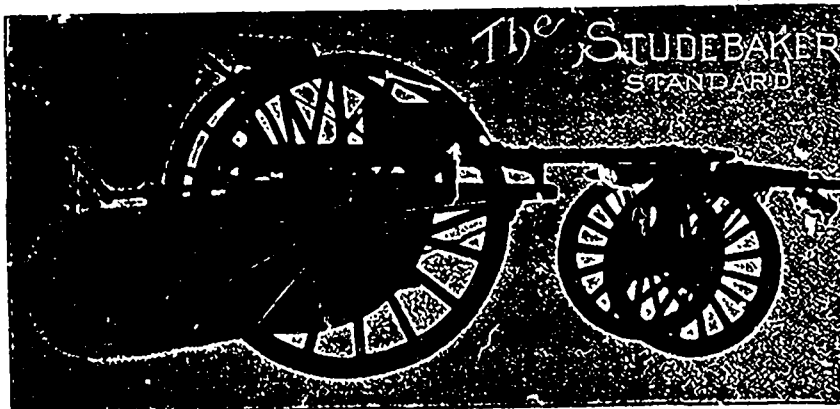
