A second class resembles a sponge; which imbibes everything, and returns it in nearly the same state, only a little dirtier. A third class is like a jelly-hag, which allows all that is pure to pass away, and retains only the refuse and the drogs. The fourth may be compared to the slave of Golconda, who custing aside all that is worthless, preserves only the pure gems."—Parish Visitor, N. Y.
