

In 1970, Canada had more than 6 1/2 million private cars, 41 thousand buses and 11/2 million commercial vehicles. In cities, efforts are being made to relieve traffic congestion which is the inevitable result of the fact that there is a car for every three Canadians. Dial-a-bus systems are in operation in Regina and the eastern part of Toronto. Both Montreal and Toronto have subway systems.

Canada has been well served by her means of transportation. Major achievements, like the St. Lawrence Seaway (an inland waterway extending 2,342 miles), and containerization for trans-shipment of goods, have moved Canada into the forefront of modern commerce.
