Ulysse Comtois was born in 1931 at Granby, Quebec. He studied at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts in Montreal and later joined the Automatiste Group. He received a Canada Council Grant in 1967 and represented Canada at the Venice Biennial in 1968.

9. Sculpture, Cafeteria Court, by Arthur Handy.

This work, located in the garden court off the main floor cafeteria, is a simple form made of strong flat planes of sheet metal painted with epoxy in a deep red. The simplicity of the form contrasts with the broken shapes of the trees, the granite paving and the multifaceted elevation of the building. The hard-edge quality of the sculpture and its lack of small detail provides relief from the multidetail of all other elements in this "court-yard" space.

Arthur Handy received a Bachelor of Fine Arts, Magna Cum
Laude, 1959, and a Master of Fine Arts, 1960, from New York State
College of Ceramics, Alfred, New York. He headed the Ceramics Department
at the Ontario College of Art, 1960-66, and was Artist-in-Residence and
Faculty Member at the New School of Art, Toronto, 1966-68. At present
he resides in Toronto, Ontario.
