

## COMMERCIAL MARINE TRANSPORTATION IN ARCTIC

Question No. 752—**Mr. Forrestall:**

1. What steps does the government intend to take in order to make commercial marine transportation in the Arctic safe and acceptable?

2. Does the government have any programme in operation that would produce the necessary ongoing oceanographic services in order to produce reliable navigational charts of the region and (a) if so, at what stage are these programmes in terms of eventual completion date (b) if not, is it the intention of the government to commence such studies, and, if so (i) on what date (ii) with what projected completion dates?

**Mr. John M. Reid (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council):** In so far as the Department of Environment is concerned: 1 and 2. Nautical Charts based largely on reconnaissance surveys presently exist for the major Arctic Waterways. Detailed charting activities of existing and potential ports and routes are being accelerated to meet demands. Intensive survey work has been carried out over the past twenty years but, because of the requirement for continued updating of Nautical Charts, a final completion date cannot be projected. In so far as the Ministry of Transport is concerned: 1. The government presently provides aids to navigation, ice-breaking support and regulations concerning ship construction and manning in the north.

2. These are continuously under review and are being updated to meet the need.

## CNR—COMMUTER SERVICE IN MONTREAL

**Hon. Jean-Eudes Dubé (Minister of Public Works):** In so far as the Department of Public Works is concerned. A. 1961-62, Minor repairs and upkeep; 1962-63, Minor repairs and upkeep; 1963-64, Minor repairs and upkeep; 1964-65, Minor repairs and new porch; 1965-66, Minor repairs and new porch; 1966-67, Minor repairs and new porch; 1967-68, Repairs to flooring and install new tiles first floor. Excavation to install new water line from Main House to well. Excavation for frozen water line and change defective foot valve. Minor repairs and maintenance. 1968-69, Minor repairs and upkeep; 1969-70, Exterior painting, new asphalt shingle roof; Minor repairs and upkeep; 1970-71, Minor repairs and upkeep; 1971-72, Interior painting, repairs to pipes and water pump, repair frozen water line, oil leak. Clean basement floor and equipment caused by oil leak. Minor repairs and upkeep.

B. 1965-66, Replaced old furnishings (no details available, as all bills are only kept 5 years.); 1966-67, Replaced old furnishings (no details available-see above); 1968-69, Mattress, box spring, bedspread, etc. Externalite No. 455, installation of rugs, 1st floor installation of carpets, 2nd floor—bedrooms and hall; 1971-72, Roller blinds and venetian blinds.

C. 1964-65, Installation fire alarm; 1966-67, Installation Aerators—Edwards Lake; 1967-68, Installation of Water Softener; Construction of Dam—Edwards Lake; New aluminum flag pole; Metal storm windows; 1968-69, Alterations to Boat House. Underground water and electrical services. Chlorination (Guest House).
