Entrance tickets for games in this period should be bought immediately in one's own country.

We have delegated the Educational Service Dept. of the Hamburg=American Line/North German Lloyd, 57 Broadway, New York N. Y., to receive the full sum for us as well as to secure the complete accommodations as arranged above. Each student has the freedom to choose an earlier steamer, prolong the stay in Germany or substitute other places of interest to visit. For every group of twenty=five leaving New York with the June 18th sailing, the University of Heidelberg will provide an instructor as accompaniment who will be in a position to give introductory information and a daily lesson in the German language during the ocean crossing.
