

Travel accomodations, living costs, etc.

(for the Heidelberg Summer School 1936)

In order to help the students taking part in the Heidelberg summer courses, to bring down their traveling and living expenses as far as possible, the University of Heidelberg has arranged the following plan:

Departure, from New York, of Steamer „S. S. Deutschland“	June 18th
Arrival at Hamburg	June 26th
Beginning of courses in Heidelberg	June 29th
End of courses	Aug. 8th
Arrival in New York with Steamer „S. S. Deutschland“	Aug. 21st

Costs:

Ocean fare from New York to Hamburg and return	\$ 169
Plus U. S. Revenue tax	\$ 5
Visit in Hamburg and harbor, — incl. sightseeing trips meals and hotel accomodations	} \$ 76
Railway fare from Hamburg to Heidelberg and return	
Room and board in Heidelberg during the vacation courses. Sightseeing trips (6 days) in and around Heidelberg, the Black Forest and Lake Constance	
So that total costs will not exceed	<u>\$ 250</u>

Supplement for those wishing to go to the Olympic Games will be . . \$ 20
 (including railway fare Heidelberg — Berlin — Hamburg, room and board in Berlin from August 7th to August 12th).

Entrance tickets for games in this period should be bought immediately in one's own country.

We have delegated the Educational Service Dept. of the Hamburg-American Line/North German Lloyd, 57 Broadway, New York N. Y., to receive the full sum for us as well as to secure the complete accomodations as arranged above. Each student has the freedom to choose an earlier steamer, prolong the stay in Germany or substitute other places of interest to visit. For every group of twenty-five leaving New York with the June 18th sailing, the University of Heidelberg will provide an instructor as accompaniment who will be in a position to give introductory information and a daily lesson in the German language during the ocean crossing.
