That in Ostober 1709, Captain Taylour, Your Majefty's Commodore, being then whomfoever he fhould find most deferving upon the Place (the former Governour Your Petitioner was Commission'd and Appointed Governour and Commande Sca Coast between Ferryland and Carbonere Island, which he accepted of at the Traders, and all other the Inhabitants on the Place; and your Petitioner hath of tepos'd in him by Your Majefty, at his own great Charge hitherto, and to the g Wherefore Your Petitioner humbly hopes, he having Jupplanted no one's Pretension (where the Station, he shall fall under Tour Majefty's most Gracious Confideration for the
