A forecast of generally stormy sonditions, threatening to interfere further with the drying out of the grop and retard to a serious extent much desired shipments, was the immediate reason for the bulge. Closing figures were steady at 3-8c to 5-8c advance over last night. Wheat finished unchanged to 1-4c up, oats with a gain of 3-8c to 5-8c and hog products less expensive by 2 1-2c to 10c.
