

UNION STOCK YARDS OF TORONTO LIMITED HORSE DEPARTMENT

All Classes Decline From 15c to 30c — Top Exporters at \$7.25 — Choice Butchers \$6.75 to \$6.90.

Receipts of live stock at the market comprising cattle, 493 head, 734 sheep and lambs and 177 calves. No coyotes can appreciate how dull and unattractive the market was for cattle and sheep classes. No one who had them to sell could get a bid. At no previous time this year have buyers been so slow to bid. The local dealers were not in the purchasing of cattle as they did the other day. There was only one buyer from out of town, and he was not in the local market, but one who usually buys heavily bought very few. Generally the market was from 10c to 25c below the lowest price it was one week or 10 days.

It looks as if the buyers had decided to wait until the market had had a price advance for some time had to come down to lower levels.

Some of the sellers of beef claim that the prices paid to-day are still too low to fit in with the way beef is selling on the outside market. Some of the farmers who were slack all day, and sellers experienced much difficulty in getting rid of their stock. There were from 500 to 800 cattle reported to have been sold.

Exporters.
