**CYCLONE AT SASKATOON.**

Serious Damage Done to Farms North  
of the City.

Saskatoon July 15.—The storm which struck Saskatoon at six o'clock last night was felt but slightly compared with the damage wrought on farms to the north of the city. W. A. Silverwood, owning 750 acres of grain, acknowledged by experts to be the finest

drop between Saskatoon and Prince Albert, was completely halted out. Workmen who were on the farms at the time of the occurrence state that it was something in the nature of a cyclone. The stones were not particularly large, but they were blown with tremendous force.
