RALLY IN CHICAGO WHEAT

Futures Recover Owing to Cash Demand

For Both Foreign and Domestic Requirements—Receipts Continue Rather Light and Cash Prices Are Up—European and Pacific Crops—Notes and Gossip.

Tuesday Evening, Aug. 23.

Wheat futures rallied again in Chicago to-day, and at the close this month's delivery stood 1/8c higher than yesterday's final figures, and the September and December options had gained 1/2c and 3/4c respectively for the session. The market had been over-sold yesterday, and the good foreign and domestic demand, together with light receipts, gave prices a higher tendency.

On the Liverpool board to-day spot wheat declined 3/4c to 2d per cental, the extreme loss being in red winter. As for futures, the Sept. delivery fell off 1/4c, while the December delivery edged up the extent of 1/4c per cental. Paris futures closed 10c to 3c centimes down.

Corn fell 1/4c a bushel at Chicago, but the Liverpool board spot maize lost 1/2c, but futures advanced 1/4c per cental for the day.

Flour declined to 2 1/2c in Liverpool to-day.

Land declined 6d in Liverpool.

Sept. wheat puts in Chicago 6 1/4c, calls 6 1/2c. Sept. corn puts 22 1/2c, calls 23c.

Primary receipts wheat and flour to-day, 653,000 bushels, against 723,000 bushels some day last year. Shipments 470,000 bushels, against 560,000 same day last year.

Primary receipts corn to-day 410,000 bushels, against 370,000 bushels some day last year. Shipments 631,000 bushels, against 561,000 bushels same day last year.

Liverpool receipts wheat past three days 256,000 centals, including 119,000 centals of American; corn 55,500 centals.

The quality of the wheat today 22c, against 30c same day last year.

Toledo receipts of wheat today 22c, against 21c, and of flour 2 1/2c, against 2 1/2c.

Total clearances wheat and flour to-day equal to 681,000 bushels; corn 226,000 bushels.

Russia is reported to have an immense crop this season, which is unfortunate in the eyes of the Canadian and American farmers and dealers.

Hog receipts at chief western points to-day, 38,000, against 47,000 same day last year.

Decrease in World's Visible.

Bradstreet's makes the decrease in the world's visible wheat supply last week 2,485,000 bushels, of which 1,388,000 bushels was east of the Rockies, and 2,100,000 bushels in European stocks. The world's increase in corn was 182,000 bushels.

Pacific Slope Wheat Crop.

A San Francisco, Cal. wire, dated Tuesday, says: The wheat harvest is about over, and a report will be made when the returns are all in. The annual yield has ranged from 1,707,500 short tons to 1,570,000 short tons last year, with a conceded average of 1,600,000 tons a year. This year the lowest estimate is 2,200,000 tons, and the highest estimate, of 3,000,000 tons. Nothing was raised in the extreme south, and the west side of San Joaquin is as bare as a floor.

On the east side, among the foot hills, small patches gave from fair to poor returns, the "swamp" lands in the river basin, where moisture is plenty, promised heavy yields, but a hot north wind in June shelled out the ripe grain, and the result was a small yield. In the north, portions of the Sacramento Valley gave a good yield.
