

New York Newspapers Carry Ads Over Doherty's Name.

NEW YORK, Oct. 14.—All New York morning newspapers this morning earry a three-column advertisement signed by Charles J. Doherty. Canadlan minister of justice, and addressed to all Canadian residents of the United States who come within the scope of the military service act of October 13, 1917, ordering their return to Canada on or before November 10.

The order which is peremptory in tone calls for the return of "all male British subjects unmarried on the 6th day of July, 1917, or widowers having no children, ordinarily resident in Canada, or who have resided in Canada at any time since the 4th of August, 1914, and who at the time of the proclamation were at least 20 years old and born not earlier than 1833, and who do not come within any of the exceptions specified by the act."

PRESIDENT RALLIES AMERICAN PEOPLE TO 'PUT OVER' HUGE LOAN

Asks Nation To Get Together Oct. 24 and Make It Success.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 15.—President Wilson, in behalf of the Liberty Loan last night issued a proclamation setting aside October 24 as Liberty Loan day, and urging the people of the nation to assemble on that day in their respective communities and "pledge to one another and to the Government that represents them the fullest measure of financial support."

"Let the result be so impressive and emphatic," the president urges, "that it will echo throughout the empire of our enemy as an index of what America intends to do to bring this war to a victorious conclusion."

Petrograd Oct. 15.—General Chablovsky, president of the commission of inquiry into the Korniloff affairs, has returned to Petrograd, and in an interview with local newspapermen declared that he did not see in the actions of General Korniloff and the other accused officers any character of high treason. 
