ALBERTA CANNOT STOP IMPORT OF LIQUOR, RULING

Appeal Division of Supreme Court Says Legislation Ultra Vires.

CALGARY, July 2.—The appeal division of the supreme court in a ruling handed down at Edmonton on Wednesday, has decided that the legislation passed by the Provincial Government with regard to the import into and export out of Alberta of liquor, is ultra vires of the powers of the local House.

The decision of the court means that importation of liquor into the province will be continued as before the recent legislation. Hundreds of orders for points in British Columbia and Saskatchewan are in the hands of local wholesalers and the next few days will doubtless be busy ones in this line.

WILL APPEAL AGAIN.

EDMONTON, July 2.—The attorney-general's department will enter an appeal in the supreme court of Canada against the decision of the Alberta appellate court in the Gold Seal liquor export case. It is the intention of the department to carry on the case, if necessary, to the privy council.

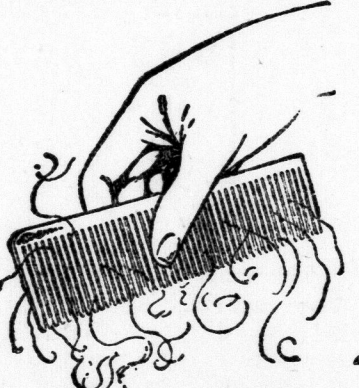

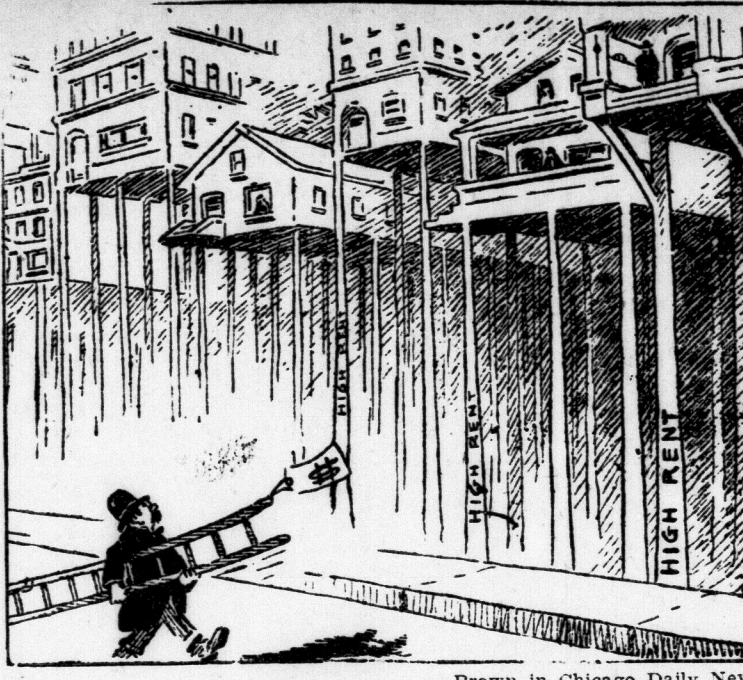

OTTAWA, July 2.—All is not harmony within the followers of the newly-constituted "National Liberal and Conservative party." It is but one day old, and yet there are men already who are endeavoring to abolish the conjunctive "and" and to put a hyphen in its place. Nobody seems to know what the word "nationalist" is meant to convey to the electors. Tories For Meighen.

In room 11, it is a predominantly Conservative, members are marking their ballots for Meighen. Other little groups are voting together for White, others for Calder, and still others for Drayton. A few, who fear destruction, favor the appointment of George Foster and a continuation of the policy of "drift." From present indications Meighen will secure a heavy vote. But Meighen is feared by some of the "old heads," and Meighen is not believed to be the man to lead the Conservative party.

On afterthought there is a substantial number of the followers of "Union" who believe that the complete abandonment of the name under which they came together in 1917 is a frank and open admission that the union has failed generally, and that the name is an unsavory one in the nostrils of the electors. It is understood that he has found quite a number of the members of yesterday's "harmonious" caucus of his own way of thinking.

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Further Resignations.

In the meantime there are all sorts of rumors of further resignations. Hon. Dr. Reid, minister of railways, would like to retire to a safe place in the senate. Hon. Martin Burrell, minister of customs, has long had his eye on a British Columbia vacancy in that chamber. Hon. A. L. Sifton, secretary of state, has not been well for some time past, and there is an Alberta vacancy in the senate with which he might be satisfied. Hon. C. J. Doherty, minister of justice, it is said, does not care to remain long after Sir Robert. Hon. A. K. Maclean, former minister without portfolio, has been out for some time, and will join the Liberals. And Hon. N. W. Rowell, president of the privy council, has been urged to resign, and has only been dissuaded from so doing by certain of the Liberal-Unionists to whom he has promised that he will consult his friends in Ontario before making up his mind.

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LAW'S RESTRICTION PROTECTS OFFENDER OF INNOCENT CHILD

Beastly Crime Alleged Against St. Thomas Resident Unpunished.

ST. THOMAS, July 2.—Because corroborative evidence cannot be obtained, a man, or beast, said to reside in rooms on Talbot street, cannot be prosecuted for a heinous offence committed against a boy of tender years. The man is alleged to have secured the confidence of the little lad by gifts of candy, and enticed him to the ravine at the rear of New street, where it is said he was seen by a resident on the hillside to commit the offence. An alarm was raised, but the fellow got away, but not before he was partially identified.

The mother of the child was told of the crime, but could not lay a charge because the evidence of the little one alone is not considered by law to be sufficient to convict, and the party who saw the crime committed is reluctant to support the evidence of the little one.

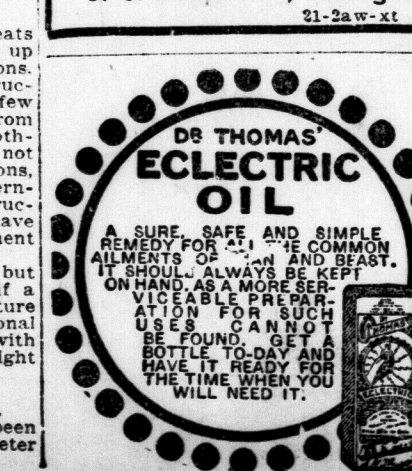

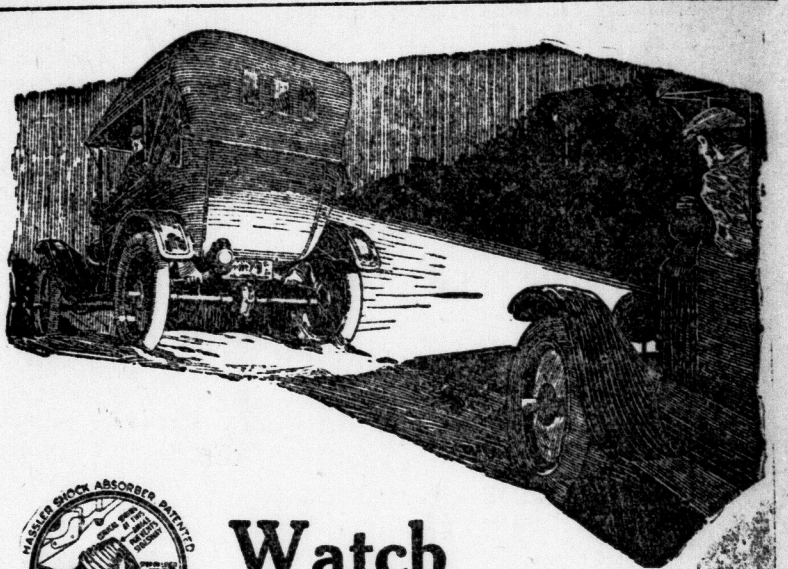
