DR. HACKETT FOR MAYOR OF WEST TORONTO CITY

Chairman of Board of Education is Definitely in Race Against Mayor Baird.

WEST TORONTO, Dec. 15.—(Special) There will be a keen contest for the mayoralty of this city at the coming municipal elections. To-day Dr. W. T. Hackett, chairman of the board of education for the past year, has announced himself as the progressive citizens' candidate for mayor in opposition to Mayor Baird, who has been mayor for two successive terms, and now aspires to a third term. Dr. Hackett is one of the most prominent citizens here, and also not obtruding himself in civic affairs, has always enthusiastically identified himself with the progress of the city. He has been a resident of the city for five years, and has large property interests, is prominent in his profession wholly within the limits of the city, and is altogether a representative taxpayer. As chairman of the board of education he has taken a large part in the furthering of the now matured plan of erecting a large and beautiful public school, which, should annexation materialize, will place this city in excellent situation to master its educational problem. The building of this school, which will be a credit to the city, was opposed by Mayor Baird, and it was only thru the reasonable but determined efforts of Dr. Hackett and his colleagues on the board that the project was put thru. Dr. Hackett's friends received this announcement with pleasure, for they have been waiting the opportunity of showing him how much they appreciate what he has done as chairman
