That the Frovince Has Reaped a Profit of \$372,000.


WINNIPEG, Man., Feb. 22.-There was laid on the table of the local legislature the second annual re-port of the Manitoba Government tele-Allan Studholme (East Hamilton) report of the Manitoba Government telephones.

It showed that there was the large, place to go for farm laborers. surplus of \$372,000 in operating. The total expenditure was \$782,000, and total receipts were \$754,000. 




