

BRITAIN WILL LEND TWO **VESSELS TO START NAVY**

Will be Manned at First by British Officers and Crews-Some Day Shipyards in Canada for Building Navy Vessels, but Not Likely Soon.

Montreal, Aug. 26—The Canadian Associated Press, London, cables as follows:
The Canadian Associated Press learns on high authority that the vessels to be loaned to the Canadian government will be two third-class cruisers, one for the Pacific and the other for the Atlantic. These ships will require refitting and alterations which will be done on this side at the expense of the Canadian government. The officers of these ships will also be loaned to Canada and apid by Canada.
