To Preserve Peaches.—Clean your peaches, by pouring hot water upon them, and afterward wiping them with a coarse cloth; put them into glass or earthen jars, cork them up and fasten the corks with wire or strong twine; then place the jars in a keettle of hot water until the atmospheric air is expelled from the jars; after which seal them up tight with wax.
