

# Wins 7-Year Fight To Teach Again

Lena M. Zippel. Dismissed and Adjudged Insane, is Re-instated.

New York, Sept. 15.—Miss Lena M. Zippel, a teacher in Public School 85, who in June, 1916, was dismissed on charges of misconduct and was adjudged insane, has won her seven years' battle for vindication and reinstatement when at a meeting of the Board of Education her appointment to Public School 19, Manhattan, was approved. The appointment dates from today.

Get \$1666 Back Pay. Miss Zippel was a familiar figure at Albany, where year after year the Legislature acted adversely on her petitions for reinstatement. Finally, last July a bill was passed and signed by Governor Smith which authorized review of the case by the civil courts. The Board of Education was then instructed to pay her \$16,666.88, salary with interest since dismissal.

"Justice at last," said Miss Zippel when informed of the board's action. "People laughed at me because I did not have enough money to retain a counsel and fought my own case. I have been working in a publishing house trying to make enough to live on. I was 'railroaded' to the Foughkeepsie State Hospital without a fair trial. Now, however, I am satisfied that my character has been restored and no question of my mental ability remains."

The board postponed election of two associate superintendents to fill vacancies caused by the retirement of Edgar Duns Shiner and John H. Walsh. The election, which came up at the Aug. 9 meeting, was laid over until the next meeting.

Superintendent of Schools Ettinger was authorized to appoint a committee to organize and direct relief work of the Department of Education in aid of the Japanese earthquake sufferers. The action was taken at the request of the Board of Superintendents.

PLASTERERS ABLE TO PICK JOBS PAYING \$105 WEEKLY

New York, Sept. 14.—"Snowballing" of building wages, less popular among bricklayers, who are becoming more plentiful than jobs, is being pushed by the finishing trades such as plasterers, plumbers, tile setters, marble workers and steamfitters, according to build-

ing contractors. Plasterers pick jobs on work that bring in about \$105 a week, including Sunday work at double time, and five and a half week days at \$14 overtime each day, making a standard per diem. The men in the other trades mentioned get at least one hour of the owner's cost sheet.

## INFANT DEATH RATE LOWER.

A big reduction in the infant deaths since the introduction of pasteurized milk was reported by Dr. William Warwick in his recent report to the Board of Health. For the years 1920-21-22 the infant deaths average 13 for July and 16 for August, in the present year they had fallen to 6 and 8 respectively. He also reported the cases of typhoid had been reduced by about one sixth.
