RADIO DIRECTS ARTILLERY FIRING IN WESTERN CANADA

Calgary, Sept. 8.—Radio telephony was used by an aeroplane in directing artillery fire for the first time in Canada at Camp Sault yesterday. An aeroplane from High River government air station, co-operated with the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery and assisted the firing by means of radio-telephony. Officers of the artillery state that the directions of the shot in the air were heard distinctly on the ground and enabled them to correct the firing of the battery with great accuracy.
