Decision Against Boston District Attorney on Several Counts in Charges.

Boston, Feb. 21.—(Canadian Press.)—
District Attorney Jos. C. Pelletier of
Suffolk county was removed by the
supreme court today. The court found
him guilty in several counts under
charges of malfeasance, misfeasance and
non-feasance in office. non-feasance in office.

The trial of Pelletier, before the full bench of the Massachusetts Supreme Court, which began on December 27 last and ended January 24, was the second hearing of the kind in the state's history and involved thirty-two specifications of alleged "malfeasance, hisfeasance and non-feasance in office" formulated by the grievance committee of the Boston Bar Association and by Attorney-General J.
