### Business Outlook In The Dominion

(Toronto Globe)

There is room for increasing confidence in the business outlook in Canada. The winter nears its end, and with it goes the greatest danger of critical conditions. The very low percentage of unemployment, reported by the department of labor—less than four per cent in trades unions—confirms the feeling of observers that business, even in the larger cities, has not been quite as bad as was expected. Smaller cities in the east have had little trouble, and reports go to indicate that business is being quickly adjusted and are thriving. This applies especially to makers of agricultural implements, automobiles and stoves.

This is not to say that conditions are wholly rosy, for there are a few handicaps. Community prices, for reasons difficult to discern, have been extremely slow to revert to anything like normal. Labor does not want wages reduced, and while wages remain at prevailing rates, there is a limitation of production and of construction. Merchants will not buy heavily at prevailing prices for fear of an early slump and consequent loss. In spite of this fact, however, the outlook is advancing.

Manufacturing is advancing to a pace, but here and there a large plant, such as the Nova Scotia Steel Company, has been temporarily closed down for better conditions and to renovate the plant. Bank clearings in the east show a steady increase in comparison with last year, but in the west there are many decreases, as would naturally come from the partial failure of the crop, followed by a serious delay in shipments. Conditions west of the Great Lakes reflect how dependent the prairie provinces are on good weather and opportunities for marketing. A high price for wheat is not enough; there must be a good crop, and the railways and buyers must get it away and pay for it.

Financial statements by many companies show large liquid assets which should enable them to face new conditions courageously. War brought great profits to employers, as well as high wages to workers, who shared in the inflation incident to intensive production. Provincial governments, too, report overflowing treasuries, as taxation was high and much was saved during the war through cessation of ordinary work. This will provide funds for public works during the months while returned soldiers are being re-established and industry generally is being readjusted.

There is disappointment over the failure of the expected export trade to materialize in any considerable volume, and the incident heralds intense rivalry by the future. The United States appears to have fared better than Canada in the call for food for Europe, though pressure is bringing concessions, such as a removal of the discrimination, probably unintentional, in the licenses for importation from Canada. In seeking future markets Canadian manufacturers will have to consider the special needs of countries which have been so unfamiliar. It will never do to try and force the implements that would suit Ontario on the primitive farmers of Roumania, Serbia, or China. The point illustrates the great need of an aggressive commerce department with trade attaches who are practical and experienced men in foreign countries.

low, woollens and cottons, iron and steel, building materials of all kinds are scarce and needed; repair work has been neglected for four years, and thousands of new houses are required at once. There is no scarcity of money, as the increases in bank savings accounts show, while bond dealers are unable to supply securities enough for would-be investors. Much still depends on the peace conference and on the Canadian budget. Until both are disposed of, there is a real and acceptable peace no one can measure the extent of the sporadic unrest that is troubling Europe. Bolshevism in North America is quite improbable, judging by the quick failure of the general strike at Seattle. The tariff is yet to be settled, or at least the form of a new taxation made known, and when the finance minister has named his revenue plans the impetus is yet to be given to new so-called business move on in a great peace drive.

The regular session of the St. John County District Lodge, I. O. G. T., was held at Nerepis, Kings County, with R. L. Kirkpatrick, D. C. T., presiding. A committee was appointed to draw up resolutions expressing the lodge's stand on the temperance question, which opposed any modification of the provincial act, and also that the federal order-in-council be made permanent by legislation.
