Montreal, June 13—One thousand men, after leaping over and breaking down the fences of the Canada Car Works at Turcot, swarming over the buildings like angry bees, carried off the workers there by sheer force and marched with them to the Dominion Steel Works, two miles distance to present their demands for an increase of four cents an hour for tradesmen and for weekly, in the place of bi-weekly, pay.

At 6 o'clock this morning, police chief Coleman, with Sergeant Collins and ten constables arrived on the scene to prevent outbreaks which might result in serious damage to property and accidents to individuals and will maintain their posts untl 6 o'clock tought.
