Another year has ended, and we briefly review our work with feelings of thankfulness, that even in a small measure we have been enabled to reveal our Saviour's love by helping others.

Our attention has principally been given to Dorcas work, 99 garments having been made and distributed as follows:—

Protestant Infants' Home 12, Hervey Institute 12, Foundling and Infant Nursery 12, Day Nursery 12, Miss McSween, missionary nurse, for distribution, 12, and to our own poor 39, also 44 yards of material, and four complete suits of girls' clothing, kindly sent by Mrs. R. W. Graham.

Material has been given to the East End Mission School, to be made up into garments by the children.

In answer to an appeal for assistance on behalf of St. Margaret's Home, Mrs. E. B. Greenshields, Mrs. Gibb Shaw, Mrs. Stearns, and Mrs. A. Allan, kindly undertook the responsibility of the Floral table at a Fair which was held in the latter part of April, the gratifying result of which was \$379.50.

We take this opportunity of thanking those ladies who have kindly undertaken the duty of collecting, Dr. Barclay for his kindness in opening our meetings, and all those who in any way have assisted us in carrying on our work.

We regret that through illness, we have been deprived of the kindly help and counsel of our president, Miss Greenshields, but trust she may soon be restored to us in her usual health and strength.

We look forward to a year of increased usefulness, and earnestly hope that many more of the ladies of the congregation may shew their sympathy by becoming members, so that by united effort and earnestness of purpose we may employ the blessings God has bestowed upon us more diligently in promoting the comfort and happiness of those less highly favored than ourselves.
