This is doubtless a measure that will be hailed with delight in many of the less civilized sections of the Mother Country, where the wife is literally the husband's drudge and slave, but it is to be hoped that the offer though it is occasionally committed here will never become so serious as to require special legislative interference in this country though, undoubtedly the existing state of affairs even here is susceptible of im.

MR. BRASSY, M. P., recently delivered a lecture to the members of the Royal Colonial Institute in which he said the nation had done something to prove the resources of the Empire by transporting 7,000 natives of India to the island fortresses in the Mediterrean, but would achieve a far greates thing if a force of 70,000 seamen of Anglo-Saxon race and language were enrolled as an Imperial Naval Reserve in the North American dependencies.
