London, Sept. 8, 1887.-The letter containing the invitation to Mr. Gladstone to attend the centennial celebration of the adoption of the American constitution, at Philadelphia was dated June 24, and was signed by Messrs. Kasson, Little, Caron and Cochran for the committee.

Mr. Gladstone was invited as a guest of the committee, and he was informed by the gentlemen who conveyed to him the invitation that it was the only one sent to any person not an American citizen or an accredited diplomat, the exception in his case being intended as an express recognition of the historical ties which bound Great Britain and America together.
