Low Fares for Dominion Day

Montreal, June 21. - Fares at the lowest level in years and with generous time allowance for use of return portions of these tickets will be good for Dominion Day holiday, July 1st, it was announced by C. P. Riddell, Manager of the Canadian railways, members of the Association, at the rate of one and a quarter times the one-way first class fare, good between portions of these tickets will be good from noon on Thursday, June 30, until noon Sunday, July 3, and the return portions good on trains on July 4th, Dominion Day falling this year on Friday, provides another "long week-end" holiday and it is anticipated that passenger travel over the holiday will set up new records.

RAILWAYS NEWS

St. Joseph University Honors

Two Canadian National Railways officials were honored by St. Joseph's University, Moncton, N. B., by the conferring of the degree of Bachelor of Science in Commerce, Bliss A. Bourgeois, Treasurer of the Atlantic Region, was one of the recipients of the degree. He is a native of Moncton Parish, being born at St. Anselme, and entered the service of the Intercolonial Railway as Clerk in the Chief Superintendent's office in June, 1910, and in 1914 was promoted to Bookkeeper and subsequently Chief Clerk in the Chief Accountant and Treasurer's Department. In June, 1915, he was appointed Assistant to the Comptroller and Treasurer, Canadian Government Railways and in May, 1924, was made General Paymaster and in January, 1929, Treasurer of the Atlantic Region of the Canadian National. The other recipient of the degree is James H. Brown, General Storekeeper of the Atlantic Region of the Canadian National at Moncton who entered the service of the Intercolonial Railway as Junior Clerk in the Mechanical office at Riviere du Loup in July, 1902. In January, 1906, he was made Timekeeper and served later in a clerical capacity. In August, 1912, he was appointed Train Agent reverting back to Clerk at Riviere du Loup and on February 1st, 1915, was made Storekeeper at Chaudiere Jct. where he remained for a short time when he was transferred as Storekeeper to Riviere du Loup. In March, 1920, he was appointed Storekeeper at St. Malo and in August, 1924, Acting District Storekeeper being made District Storekeeper on June 1st, 1924. In June, 1928, he was transferred to Toronto as District Storekeeper and on August 1, 1929, was appointed Assistant General Storekeeper of the Atlantic Region with headquarters at Moncton and on April 1st, 1930, General Storekeeper.
