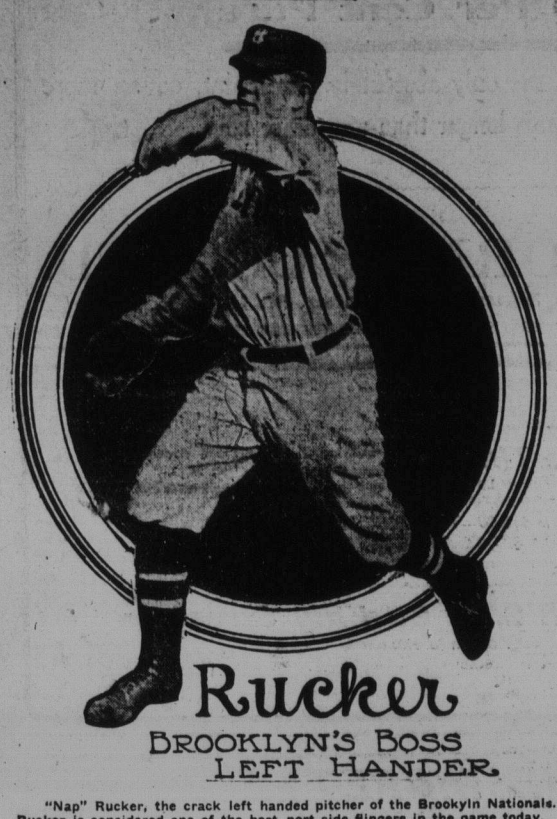

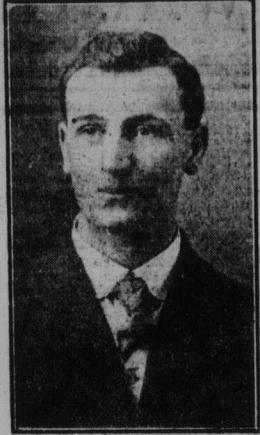


Rucker BROOKLYN'S BOSS LEFT HANDER

ERN. STIRLING IS ON HIS WAY TO WINNIPEG

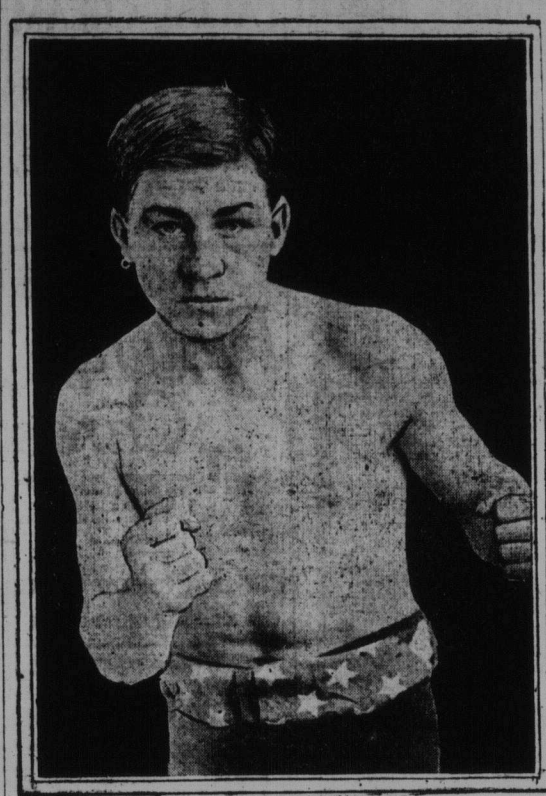
