Besides, there are his mother, Mrs. Caroline McLeod, of Boston; his sister, Mrs. Mary McLeod, of Boston; Mrs. Geo. A. Dickson, of St. John, and Mrs. Wm. McK. Blewett, of Montreal; and two brothers, Sergeant McLeod, of the 140th Battalion, and Sergeant William McLeod, formerly of the 10th Battalion, now in France. Funeral arrangements will be announced later.

London, Mar. 30.—The taking of testimony in the trial of Mrs. Wheeldon, the two daughters, Alfred George Mason, husband of the daughters, was resumed before Justice Low in the Old Bailey this morning, where the prisoners are charged with conspiring to murder Premier George and Mr. Arthur Herby.
