The Court of Appeal at Albany has granted Stakes a new trial; the decision was unexpected to the public and creates a profound impression. He has no idea what action his counsel will now take, but the impression prevails that they will move that he be admitted to bail, so several months must elapse before he can again be put upon trial.

THE ISLE OF BREDA MURDER.

ALEXANDER, MEX. June 10.

At nine this morning County Attorney Geo. C. Yeaton opened the case for the Government in the Wagner trial. He made a lengthy address to the jury, giving them minute particulars of the murder, dwelling at length upon the jurisdiction, explaining the boundary of the county, and proving by old records that the case can be legally tried in this county (York). The witnesses for both sides were excluded from court, and will be called to stand separately, as the case demands. The prisoner manifested no emotion. Even while the County Attorney recited the details of the terrible act his countenance remained unchanged, wore an incredulous smile. The court room was crowded to suffocation, and the excitement hourly increased. Large numbers from Portsmouth and vicinity are arriving upon every train.

ATTEMPTING TO WRECK A TRAIN.

CLAYTON RHT, Ont. June 10.

For several days past obstructions have been placed across the Erie and Niagara Railroad track, between Chippewa and Black Creek, in the shape of railway ties, with the evident intention of throwing the express train of the county (York). The parties suspected were watched and detected in making another attempt to throw the express train off last evening, and one of them has been placed in the hospital across the track. The men implicated are a father and son living near Black Creek.

LONDON, June 10.

ASCOT RACES.

The annual races on Ascot Heath commenced to-day and were attended by a great crowd. The Prince of Wales stakes were won by Kather, Gang Forward being second, and Combat third. Uhan was the winner of the Ascot stakes, with Houghton second and Vanddecken third. Nine ran. The gold cup was won by Thoma, with Hannah second and Stream third. Seven ran.

THE CRISIS IN SPAIN.

The Ministry tendered their resignation to-day and Figueras was unable to form a new Cabinet. At last accounts political affairs were utterly unsettled.

IN THE FRENCH ASSEMBLY.

Gambetta read a Government circular offering subsidies to the press, which caused great excitement. The Minister of the Interior admitted its authenticity. Finally a motion supporting the Government was carried by 74 majority.

NEW YORK, June 10.

COLLEGIATE DISASTER.

There was an explosion of fire damp in the Henry Clay college near Shanook, Pennsylvania, yesterday while fifty miners were at work. 35 saved themselves or were rescued. Of the others ten dead bodies have been recovered and the rest were missing at last accounts.

STYVOCKED WITH GAS.

Two brothers were suffocated in a gasometer at Eastport, Maine, yesterday, and a third taken out in a dangerous condition.

THE MODOC.

General Schofield telegraphs General Davis to appoint a commission on the spot for the trial of the Modocs.

INCREASING AT MEMPHIS.

Information from London says that the English Government has arranged to place in the hands of the Secretary of State in Washington, on or before 15th of September, fifteen and one half millions of dollars in gold, the amount awarded by the Geneva tribunal.
