M. Caillaux Is Looking About For French Cabinet. Paris, June 27.—M. Caillaux. Minister of Finance in the Monis Cabinet, who was requested by President Fallieres to form a new Ministry, announced last night, aft. advising with his friends, that he would be unable to give a definite answer to the President before to-night. At the same time he has made material progress towards the organization of a strong combination.

While as yet nothing definitely has been decided upon, it is understood that M. Caillaux, in addition to the Premiership, will take charge of the Ministry of the Interior; M. Doumergue or M. Cruppi, justice; L. L. Klotz, finance; Eugene Etienne or Adolphe Messimy, wark M. Delcasse, marine; Jules A. T. Steeg, public instruction; M. Augagneur, public works; M. Craumet, commerce; Jules Pams, agriculture; M. Messimy or M. Lebrun, colonies; M. Renoult, labor. Of these, MM. Cruppi, Delcasse, Steeg, Pams and Messimy were in the Monis Cabinet; MM. Klotz and Doumergue were members of the Briand Cabinets, while M. Etienne is an ex-Minister of the Interior.
