An Act to Incorporate The British American Institute.

THEREAS by certain conveyances and assurances, those Preamble. parcels or tracts of land known as part of Lot number Two and three, in the Fourth Concession of the Township of Dawn, in that part of the Province, called Upper Canada, have been as-5 signed to John Scoble, late of the City of London, Esquire, and James C. Brown, of the Town of Chatham, Bricklayer, in trust for the purpose of Education, moral, mental and physical, of the coloured inhabitants of Canada, not excluding white persons and Indians: And whereas the execution of the said trust would be in greatly facilitated by the incorporation of the said John Scoble and James C. Brown, with other fit and proper persons for the purposes aforesaid; Be it therefore enacted, &c.,

That the said John Scoble, the said James C. Brown, John Roaf, Certain per-Alexander Christie, Patrick Freeland, John Nasmith, and James sons incorporated. 15 Richardson, shall be, and is hereby constituted a body politic and Corporate corporate, by the name of "The British American Institute," and name and genby that name shall and may sue and be sued, implead and be eral powers. impleaded, answered and be answered unto, in all the Courts of law and equity whatsoever, and shall have uninterrupted succession with 20 a common seal, which may by them be changed or renewed at their pleasure; and also that they and their successors by the same name, from time to time and at all times hereafter, shall be able and capable of purchasing and holding to them and their successors, lands not exceeding. acres, to and for the use of 25 the said Institute and of letting, conveying, and otherwise disposing of the same; Provided always, that the Real Estate to be Proviso as to held by the said body politic, shall not be of any greater yearly value of real value at the time of its purchase than the sum of  $\mathcal{L}$
