Trustees may be called upon to account by Supreme Court.

IX. The Supreme Court of Civil Justice may, in a summary manner on complaint upon oath by three members of a Congregation or Religious Body of any misfeasance or misconduct on the part of Trustees in the performance of duties authorised by this Act, call upon the Trustees to give in an account; and may enforce the rendering of such account, the discharge of any duties and the payment of any money, so that the Congregation or Religious Body may have the benefit thereof, and the Court may compel the Trustees, in case of any misconduct, to pay the expense of the application or may award costs to the Trustees in ease the application is made on grounds which the Court considers insufficient or frivolous or vexatious.

Lands in towns and cities not to be used for burial purposes. X. Nothing in this Bill shall empower any Trustees of any Religious Body to occupy or use land for burial purposes within towns or cities in Vancouver's Island or its Dependencies.

Passed the Council on its return from the House of Assembly September 5th, 1859.
