Lewis opposes separatism

On Thursday, October 5, a packed McInnes Room listened to national NDP leader, David Lewis speak on the "corporate rip-off."

After a brief introduction, the leader invited questions from the floor. In response to the questions, Lewis gave the party platform on such topics as foreign investment, foreign control, taxes, and underdevelopment.

When challenged on his position on abortion, Lewis stated that abortions should be removed from the Criminal Code. But at the same time he said that the question "is a matter that seems to concern and worry a small part of the electorate. The issues that concern the Canadian electorate are those that touch his overall life."

In response to a question of Quebec separatism, Lewis stated that he and his party are opposed to it. According to Lewis, this is a hypotetical question, something that will never happen.

After warming the crowd with his brilliant rhetoric, he turned the floor over to the local candidates, Aube and Dolin at which point three-quarters of the audience left.
