

he Yeomen basketball team is at the beginning of a long restructuring period. The Yeomen have lost badly in both of their exhibition games against the Waterloo Wariors and the immediate future does not look bright.

This year's team contains 11 new members as well as two members with only one year of experience. Coach Bob Bain notes that this is a handicap for the team. "We are not big sizewise and as a result lack strength and aggression. These are glaring mistakes, and the most obvious ones," said Bain.

Among other problems are the team's poor rebound capabilities which are something the team must work hard on if it hopes to put more points on the board against its opponents. Bain cites inexperience as a major setback and as something that only time can overcome. On the other hand, the team's inexperience will be a bonus as the young players will be succeptable to new ideas and, as a result, make it easier to mold the team together.

"Usually a team has a number of systems with which to play an opponent, such as the zone press. and an opposing team will usually pick on one system to pick on. We only have one system and so we are an easy target right now," said

Things are not as gloomy as

they seem this year. This young, enthusiastic team has one thing in its favour - quickness. Although, as Bain admits, the team is average in a lot of things, it has some up-and-coming players which will help to form the team's nucleus over the next couple of years.

Among those to watch out for are, offensively, Mark Belli who is in his third year at York and has two seasons with the team although he is presently sidelined with injuries; and, defensively, Kevin Galavan and Mike Pullar. who may prove to be the type of point guards needed to bounce the team back into the running.

Other mainstays include 6'5" David Lynch from St. Gerome's in Kitchener as well as Mark Gotwald, Warren Harvey and Terry Ugwu, all of whom seem to possess the "play hard, don't give up attitude" Bain is looking for.

As Bain knows, there is a lot of work to be done between now and January (when the season starts), as the team learns to play together and to grow in depth. The competition, as always, will be fierce, especially against teams such as Victoria, Brandon, Western and Acadia.

Despite the uphill climb, there is little doubt the Yeomen will achieve the goal Bain has set out for his team. Bain wants them to be placed in the top six or seven positions in Canada, where the team had usually placed for a good 10 years before their slow
