\$85,000 city pact

Mississauga will sign an \$85,000 contract with Ontario Humane Society for services in 1975.

Tom Hughes, OHS executive vice-president, has told council this is a reduction in funds for the society and the city cannot expect an increase in

However, Hughes said that despite a 24 percent increase in costs, "We expect to carry out the same good level of service.

The city agreed to continue its contract with the society in 1975 while it investigates the possibility of setting up its own operation, or of accepting an offer from Mississauga Veterinarians Society that it operate the animalcontrol program.

A canine control committee has also

been established by Mississauga for closer municipal control over the pound operation.

Hughes said the society was hoping hat changes in Brampton would "save our bacon this year." A new pound is opening there and this should reduce the number of animals brought to the Peel animal shelter on Mavis Rd. It should allow one more staff member to operate from the Mississauga shelter.




