Summary of Evidence

in the case of

No. D. 128243 Gunner Joseph Paul Emile Aubin, No. 3-A District Depot, C.A., a soldier of the Canadian Army placed on active service.

CHARGES:---

1. Absenting himself;
2. Losing by neglect.

The accused demands that the evidence be taken on oath.

First Witness:-- Lieut. R.O. Dulmage, No. 3-A District Depot, C.A., having been duly sworn, states:---

I am Lieut. R.O. Dulmage No. 3-A District Depot, C.A. I produce M.F.B. 375 dated May 26, 1942, showing the accused, Gunner J.P.E. Aubin, absent from 1345 hours on May 1, 1942, and marked Exhibit A. I produce M.F.M. 215 showing the arrest of Gunner Aubin by Constable Greenfield of the Sudbury Police Force, in Sudbury, Ontario, at 0115 hours, July 16, 1942, and marked Exhibit B. I produce a list of deficiencies of the accused dated December 30, 1942, and marked Exhibit C.

The accused declined to cross-examine the witness.

Second Witness:-- 2/Lieut. A.V. Gaebel, No. 3-A District Depot, C.A., having been duly sworn, states:--

I am 2/Lieut. A.V. Gaebel, Assistant Quartermaster, No. 3-A District Depot, C.A., on December 30, 1942, the accused, D. 128243 Gunner J.P.E. Aubin, produced at the Quartermaster stores, boots & ankles prs. valued at \$5.20 for which he was given credit according to the prices on his M.F.B. 375.

The accused declined to cross-examine the witness.
