INFANT'S AND INVALID'S FOODS.

OTTAWA, July 24, 1909.

SIR :—I have the honour to transmit you herewith a report upon 77 samples of socalled Infant's and Invalid's Foods. The present inspection has regard to a collection ordered in April last, and represents twonty-three (23) different brands. It does not claim to cover all the kinds of Infant's and Invalid's Foods which are found upon the Canadian Market; but it probably indicates pretty fairly their general character.

The only previous collection of this kind was made in April, 1898. (See Bull. 59). At that time, one hundred and three samples (103) representing twenty-two (22) brands, were reported. Ten of these brands are represented in the present collection; and analysis shows most of these foods to be essentially of the same character as they were found eleven years ago. This is shown in the following table:--
