3. In suits for subscriptions, the suit may b a, in suits to subscriber the paper is pub-lished, although the subscriber may reside hun-dreds of miles away.

4. The courts have decided that refusing news papers or periodicals from the post office, or removing and leaving them uncalled for, while unpaid, is prima facie evidence of intentional raud.


