\$1,500 FOR DEATH OF HUSBAND

Killed at Sulphide—Right of Way Case to be Tried This Coming June.

Mr Justice Lennox at the spring assizes, at midday last night, concluding the action of LaVallee & Nichols Chemical Company at Sulphide and the trial of Morris Stewart, who was charged with arson at Trenton.

The jury found that there was negligence in the case of the Nichols Chemical Company by not replacing an old pulley with a new one, by not protecting the old pulley with a guard and not providing a proper step for a man engaged in oiling. They assessed the damages at common law at \$1,500 and the same \$1,500 under the statute.
