**Earl of Crawford For Agricultural Board**

LONDON, July 11.—The Morning papers announce that the Earl of Crawford has been offered the presidency of the Board of Agriculture vacated by Earl Selborne. Earl Crawford is Premier Earl of Scotland and previously held office as Junior Lord of the Treasury. At the outbreak of war he enlisted in the Royal Army Medical Corps for the duration of war.

**Holland's Exports Going to Germany**

ROTTERDAM, July 11.—The "new Rotterdamse Courant" says that Britain has asked Holland to stop export of manufactured goods to neutral countries, declaring that non-compliance will result in the stoppage of Holland's cotton imports. The Telegraph says Allies are merely contemplating a measure to prevent export of Dutch cotton goods to Switzerland and Roumania as it has proved that such exports are really intended for Germany.

**CHINAMEN IN CANTON REVOLT**

SHANGHAI, July 6.—General L. Lieh-Chun is fighting his way along the railway from Shuichow toward Canton, determined to enforce the demand of the residents of Canton that the rule of Governor Lung Chu Kuang of Kwang Tung province shall be ended. He came in contact with the governor's forces at Yingtak, where a battle was fought on July 3. Li Lieh-Chun's troops, marching eastward from Kwang-Si province, took Samsui on July 2.

[Yingtake is about half way from Shuichow to Canton. Samsui is about 30 miles west of Canton].
